What?

Neurodiversity at the Workplace is a learning project organized by the Faculty of Economics and Management at the Czech University of Life Sciences Prague (CZU). The programme invites students to explore, discuss, and critically reflect on the opportunities and challenges associated with neurodiversity in the workplace, with a particular focus on Human Resource Management and the future of work.

How?

The programme will begin with a kick-off session introducing students to key topics and current challenges related to neurodiversity in the workplace. Professionals from a partner company, together with lecturers from CZU, will provide practical insights and introduce a real-life business case. Students will then work in multidisciplinary teams, supported by facilitators, to explore the challenges, develop innovative and sustainable solutions, and translate their ideas into practical recommendations for the company.

Who?

This BIP is particularly suitable for students of Human Resource Management, Business, Management, Marketing, and related fields who are interested in people management, workplace inclusion, organizational development, and the future of work.

Learning outcomes

Through practical case studies, teamwork, and interaction with HR professionals, participants will gain a deeper understanding of neurodiversity and its implications for contemporary workplaces. They will explore how HR practices can better recognize and support different ways of thinking, learning, communicating, and working, while considering both organizational needs and individual strengths.

Participants will apply their knowledge to a real-life business case and develop and present their own ideas in response to the central question: How can organizations effectively embrace and manage neurodiversity in the workplace of the future?

The teaching team will include HR professionals who will share their practical experience, expertise, and insights, giving students an opportunity to connect academic concepts with real-world workplace challenges.

Accreditation

The BIP consists of a total of 75 hours of workload (3 ECTS), including online sessions, autonomous work, and on-site activities.

On-site Activities – 23-27 November, 2026

Practical information

Students will be provided accommodation on the university campus (220 EUR for 4 nights, including breakfast and socio-cultural activities).

The programme includes excursion to the partner company, city tour, welcome dinner and beer tasting at the CZU Brewery Jeník, sport/teambuilding event and a farewell dinner in a traditional Czech restaurant.
